Sculptor: **Lev Efimovich Kerbel** (1917-2003) was a well known sculptor of soviet realist works. His famous works include statues of Marx, Lenin and Yuri Gagarin.

The Karl Marx Monument is a 7.10m tall stylized head of Karl Marx in Chemnitz, Germany. The heavy-duty sculpture, together with the base platform, stand over 13 meters tall and weighs approximately 40 tonnes. On a wall just behind the monument, the phrase "Workers of the world, unite!" (from the Communist Manifesto) is inscripted in four languages: German, English, French and Russian.
